Description of Allegation / Statement of Complaint

TEXAS STATE LAW: (Government Code 614.022) requires that all complaints against police officers be in writing and signed by the person making the complaint. Just as citizens who are arrested must be notified of the charges against them, police officers must be given copies of complaints before any disciplinary action may be taken. The person who claims to be aggrieved must make the complaint. Other persons involved in the incident may give statements as witnesses. Traffic tickets issued or differences of opinion between police officers and citizens over the issuance of traffic tickets or the guilt or innocence of persons arrested will not be investigated unless there are specific allegations of misconduct against members of the Department.

(Government Code 614.023) Copy of Complaint is to be given to the officer or employee. (a) A copy of the signed complaint against a law enforcement officer of this state or a fire fighter, detention officer, county jailer or peace officer appointed or employed by a political subdivision of this state shall be given to the officer or employee within a reasonable time after the complaint is filed. (b) Disciplinary action may not be taken against the officer or employee unless a copy of the signed compliant is given to the officer or employee.

FALSE COMPLAINTS: People who intentionally make false complaints or allegations against police officers violate Chapter 37 of the Texas Penal Code. Texas law provides punishment for an individual adjudged guilty of committing an offense, if with the intent to deceive and with statement under oath or swears to the truth of a false statement previously authorized by law to be made under oath. A person who commits an offense under this section can be charged with offenses ranging from a Class B Misdemeanor to a Felony of the Third Degree. Punishments can range from confinement and a fine not to exceed \$10,000. This information is not intended to intimidate the complainant or any witnesses, but is provided to avoid retaliation against law enforcement officers or departmental staff.
